

# Pattern

## Sille & Mulle

### YARN USAGE

Teddy Grey/Beige: 60 g

Vintage Grey/Brown: 15 g

*A few meters of black yarn  
for nose and mouth.*

### MATERIALS

Embroidery yarn

Felt

Filling

Plastic granules

Eyes: 12 mm

Double pointed needles: 4,0 mm



Knitted in Go handmades Teddy:  
100% Polyester, 50 g/65 m and Go handmades  
Vintage: 70% Wool/30% Bamboo, 25 g/60 m.



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## YARN USAGE:

### SILLE:

Teddy Grey: 60 g  
Vintage Grey: 15 g

### Mulle:

Teddy Beige: 60 g  
Vintage Brown: 15 g

*A few meters of black yarn for nose and mouth.*

## MATERIALS:

Embroidery yarn  
Felt  
Filling  
Plastic granules\*  
Eyes: 12 mm  
Double pointed needles: 4,0 mm

*NB! In addition to the above, a darning needle and a sewing needle is needed.  
The given amounts of yarn are for guidance only.*

*\*This type of filling is heavy and good for stabilizing weight.*

*It is recommended that the filling continues on an ongoing basis as the work progresses.*

### Mounting of the safety eyes:

The eyes are inserted, and the rear stops to the eyes are pushed from the inside.  
The rear stops can and should be a little hard to push in to ensure that they are sticking well.

## ABBREVIATIONS AND DEFINITIONS

st(s)	Stitch(es)
k	Knit
p	Purl
k2 in same st	Increase. Knit from the front and back in same stitch before it is taken off the needle
k2 tog	Decrease. Knit 2 sts together
k3 tog	Knit 3 stitches together
p2 tog	Purl 2 sts together
* ... *	Repeat what is shown in these brackets to the end of the row (or repeat as indicated).
(..)	At the end of the line, specifies the number of sts on the needle.

## Teddy

- Luxurious yarn in the nicest colors



Soft like a dream and a yarn many have been longing for, to be used for knitting and crocheting baby ware, teddies and blankets.

A "fluffy" yarn, that doesn't require any special techniques or stitches to get a nice and chunky result. Use Teddy for cuddle animals to give them a real "teddy" look or knit/crochet a blanket for babies/toddlers.

Teddy has been awarded the AZO certificate and is thus a yarn that everyone can feel safe wearing.

100% Polyester,  
50 g/65 m.



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## SILLE & MULLE

### BODY

Work from the bottom up. Cast on 8 sts and work back and forth with Teddy yarn (garter stitch).

| 3.)        | *k2 in same st, k1* to end | (24) |

| 6. - 16.)  | k                          | (36) |
| 17.)       | *k1, k2 tog* to end        | (24) |
| 18. - 24.) | k                          | (24) |
| 25.)       | *k1, k2 tog* to end        | (16) |
| 26. - 30.) | k                          | (16) |

Thread the yarn through the stitches. Sew the body together, but leave an opening at the top.

Make a little bag (possibly of a nylon stocking) with plastic granules, place it in the bottom of the body. Stuff the rest of the body with toy stuffing and sew the opening at the top together.

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### HEAD

Cast on 6 sts and work back and forth with Teddy yarn (to be worked in garter stitch until change of yarn).

Change to Vintage. The remaining part of the head is worked in stocking stitch.

| 19. - 26.) | Stocking stitch.       | (30) |
|            | Start with a knit row. |      |
| 27.)       | *k1, k2 tog* to end    | (20) |
| 28. - 32.) | Stocking stitch        | (20) |
| 33.)       | *k1, k2 tog* to end    | (15) |
| 34.)       | p                      | (15) |
| 35.)       | *k2 tog* x 7, k1       | (8)  |

Cut the yarn, pull the yarn through the stitches, pull them together and sew the head together except for a small opening. Stuff the head with toy stuffing.

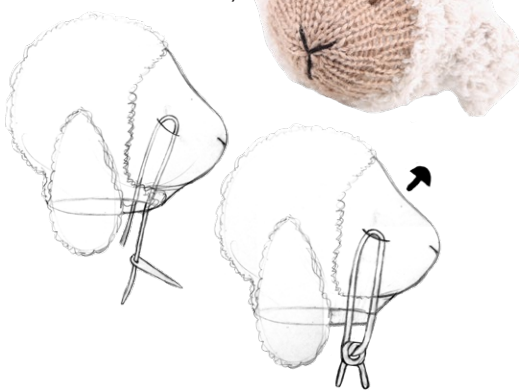
Shape the head and eye sockets by drawing a thread from the head's opening (where it will be sewn onto the body) to the placement of one of the eyes, lead the thread around a stitch, and back again. Tighten the thread to form an eye socket, and fix the thread ends by tying a knot. Repeat on the other eye. See ill.

Attach the safety eyes in row 27 and space them with approx. 6 stitches in between. The discs for the eyes are inserted from the inside, push them firmly, perhaps by using a coin.

Close the last opening.

Embroider a "Y" as a snout.

Sew the head onto the body.



## EAR (2 X)

Cast on 4 sts and work back and forth with Teddy yarn (garter stitch).

- 1.) k (4)  
2.) k2, k2 in same st, k1 (5)  
3. - 4.) k (5)  
5.) k2, k2 in same st, k2 (6)  
6. - 17.) k (6)  
18.) k2 tog, k2, k2 tog (4)

Cast off. Fold the ears at the cast-on edge and sew them onto the head.

## ARM (2 X)

Cast on 8 sts and work back and forth with Teddy yarn (to be worked in garter stitch until change of yarn).

1. - 18.) k (8)

Change to Vintage. The remaining part of the arm is worked in stocking stitch.

- 19.) \*k2 in same st, k1\* to end (12)  
20. - 26.) Stocking stitch (12)  
27.) \*k2 tog\* to end (6)

Thread the yarn through the stitches and sew the arm together.

Stuff the arm with toy stuffing with the exception of approx. the last cm. Pull together the opening at the top, and sew the arm onto the body.

## LEG/FOOT (2 X)

Cast on 14 sts and work back and forth with Vintage (to be worked in stocking stitch until change of yarn).

- 1.) p (14)  
2.) \*k2 in same st\* to end (28)  
3. - 5.) Stocking stitch (28)

- 6.) k6, k2 tog x 8, k6 (20)  
7.) p6, p2 tog x 4, p6 (16)  
8.) k5, k 3 tog x 2, k5 (12)  
9. - 11.) Stocking stitch (12)

Change to Teddy yarn. The remaining part of the leg is worked in garter stitch.

- 12.) k2 tog, k8, k2 tog (10)  
13. - 27.) k (10)

Cast off.

Sew the foot together. Start underneath the foot and sew the cast-on edge together, use small overcast stitches. Then sew together the remaining part of the foot using mattress stitch.

Gradually stuff the leg with toy stuffing as it is sewn together, but do not stuff the uppermost part too firm. Sew together the opening at the top, and sew the legs onto the body.

NB. There may occur small holes in connection with all the decreases on the foot. They can be closed by pulling them together with an end of leftover yarn from the foot.

## TAIL

Cast on 4 sts and work back and forth with Teddy yarn (garter stitch)

1. - 4.) k (4)

Cast off. Fasten the yarn at one end of the tail and use the other end of yarn to sew the tail onto the body.

## BLANKET

The corners may be rounded.

Use blanket stitch for the edges.

If you want, embroider a small heart in one of the corners so that the heart's point is pointing in towards the corner.

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# Good to know

## Needle Size & Tension

Knitters knit very differently: some knit with a needle size 2,0 mm and obtain the same size of design quality as a person who knits with a needle size 4,0 mm. We owe this knowledge to the team of knitters who join us.

The key to knit a specific size is a lot about the knitting style/hands/skills, rather than the size of needles.

Therefore, we will recommend a range of needle sizes.



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
