

Go handmade quality design in a unique style

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Tencel is a organic sustainable natural material manufactured from wood chips, primarily from beech and eucalyptus. The wood is FSC certified and comes from natural culling of the woods or leftovers from other wood production. Tencel is the most sustainable of materials, made with the most utterly environmental concerns.

The uniqueness of Tencel - soft and mild for the skin. The composition of the fibres' smooth structure from beech and eucalyptus makes Tencel material very pleasant for the skin. It's softer than silk and smoother to the skin than wool and cotton and has also a fantastic absorbent quality.

## YARN USAGE:

Size 3 mths.:

150 g Go Handmade Tencel (Double thread)

Double thread

Size 6 mths.:

200 g Go Handmade Tencel (Double thread)

**Buttons** 

Knitting needles 3,0 mm and 3,5 mm Double pointed needles (DPN's) or circular needles for the sleeves

Gauge using 3,5 mm needles (**Double thread**): 26 sts stockinette stitch = 10 cm

Yarn lengths are guideline only.

# CARDIGAN - WITH LACE AND FLOUNCE EDGING 3 MONTHS (6 MONTHS)

Cast on 272 (296) sts with N 3,0 mm. Knit 5 (5) rows in garter stitch.

Change to N 3,5 mm.

K the first and last 6 (6) sts of each row (garter stitch button band).

When the work measures 5 cm the flounce ends. K6 (6), K2tog for 130 (142) sts until the final 6 sts, k6 (6).

#### Start the lace pattern:

Add a marker for each side: 37 (40) sts, 68 (74) sts, 37 (40) sts.

K the button band sts k6 (6), k10 (12) sts (stockinette st), 15 in lace pattern, k80 (88) sts (stockinette st), 15 sts lace pattern, k10 (12) (stockinette st), k6 (6). On the 7th row, make the first buttonhole. Repeat 4 (5) times, with approx. 5 cm between buttonholes. Continue until the work measures 15 (18) cm.

### **DIVIDE FOR BACK AND FRONTS**

#### Right front

Continue in pattern until the sleeve opening measures 6 (7) cm.

#### Neckline

Put the 6 buttons band sts on a length of yarn. Size 3 months.

Bind off 4 - 3 - 3 - 2 - 1, until 18 sts.

Size 6 months.

Bind off 4 - 4 - 3 - 2 - 1, until 20 sts.

The sleeve opening measures 10 (11) cm. Bind off the shoulder sts.

#### Left front

Work as above, but opposite.

#### Back

The back is worked in stockinette st until 0,5 cm before the length of the fronts.

Bind off the middle 28 (30) sts and finish each side separately.

Bind off 1 (1) sts towards the neck line, 2 (2) times on each side, 18 (20) m.

Bind off.

Sew the shoulder sts together.

#### **SLEEVES**

Pick up 50 (54) sts around the sleeve opening. Add a marker under each sleeve (centre st). Knit 3 (3) cm in stockinette st.

Decrease on each side of the marker as described: K1, k2tog, knit until 3 sts before the marker, k2tog tbl, k1 – repeat every 2 cm, 5 (6) times.

Continue until the sleeve measures 13,5 (16,5) cm. Change to N 3,0 mm.

Knit back and forth, 7 (7) rows of garter stitch. Bind off.

Pick up 70 (76) sts around the neck opening with 3.0 mm N.

Knit 7 (7) rows of garter stitch.

Bind off and fasten the ends.

Sew the edge of the sleeve. Add buttons


## FINAL MEASUREMENTS OF THE CARDIGAN

 Circumference
 52 (54) cm.

 Length
 25 (29) cm.

 Length of sleeves
 15 (18) cm.

- = k on right side, p on wrong side
- O = yarn over
- = k2tog knit 2 st together
- $\searrow$  = k2tog tbl k2 together through the back loop

r1: k1, k2tog x 2, yo, k1, yo, k1, yo, k1, yo, k2tog tbl x 2, k3

UK r2: p

r3: k2tog x 2, yo, k1, yo, k3, yo, k1, yo, k2tog tbl x 2, k2

r4: r

r5: k3, k2tog x 2, yo, k1, yo, k1, yo, k1, yo, k2tog tbl x 2, k1

r6: p

r7: k2, k2tog x 2, yo, k1, yo, k3, yo, k1, yo, k2tog tbl x 2

r8: p

Repeat for the full length of the front.

# Needle size and tension

Knitters knit very differently: some knit with a needle size 2,0 mm and obtain the same size of design quality as a person who knits with a needle size 4,0 mm. We owe this knowledge to the team of knitters who join us. The key to knit a specific size is a lot about the knitting style/hands/skills, rather than the size of needles. Therefore, we will recommend a range of needle sizes.
