



Design 01 – Lookbook 16

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**JACKET**  
**ECOPUNO & SILKHAIR**

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**Size** 36/38 (40/42, 44/46, 48/50)

Instructions are given for first size. Figures in parenthesis refer to larger sizes. When only one figure is given, it applies to all sizes.

**Materials:** **300 (300, 350, 350) g** of Lana Grossa **Ecopuno** (72% cotton, 17% Merino wool, 11% baby alpaca; 215 m/50 g) in Ecru (**col 46**) and **150 (150, 175, 175) g** of Lana Grossa **Silkhair** (70% superkid mohair, 30% silk; 210 m/25 g) in Off White (**col 52**). Short and long size 4 mm circular needles; 4 stitch markers; 2 size 4 mm double-pointed needles [dpns]; size 4 mm crochet hook.

**Note:** Work with 1 strand of each yarn held tog throughout = 2 strands held tog.

**Two-stitch selavage:** At beg of row, sl 1 pwise, k1; at end of row, work to last 2 sts, sl 1 pwise, k1.

**Rev St st:** P on RS, k on WS.

**Garter st:** K every row.

**Full-fashion increase [neck shaping]:** On RS row: M1R, 3 sts in from each edge.

**Full-fashion increase [raglan shaping]:** On RS row: M1R before and after each marked st = 8 sts increased.

**I-cord:** With dpn, cast on 4 sts and work as foll: \* Next row (RS): With 2nd dpn, k4, do not turn. Sl sts back to beg of needle to work next row from RS, pulling yarn tightly from end of row; rep from \* until I-cord measures 30 cm. Bind off.

**Gauge:** 20 sts and 34 rows = 10 x 10 cm in garter st with size 4 mm needles and 2 strands held tog.


**Jacket:** Worked from the top down. With size 4 mm circular needle and 2 strands held tog cast on 60 sts. Next row (RS): Two-stitch selavage, 1 st in rev St st, 1 st in garter st and pm in this st, 8 sts in garter st, 1 st in garter st and pm in this st, 34 sts in garter st, 1 st in garter st and pm in this st, 8 sts in garter st, 1 st in garter st and pm in this st, 1 st in rev St st, two-stitch selavage. Next row (WS): Work in patt as set by last row. Shape neck and raglan: Working full-fashion inc for neck shaping, inc 1 st at each end of next 39 RS rows. At same time, working full-fashion inc for raglan shaping, inc 8 sts on next 34 (38, 42, 46) RS rows = 410 (442, 474, 506) sts after all neck and raglan incs have been worked. Divide for body and sleeves: Patt to first m, place next 76 (84, 92, 100) sts on holder for sleeve, cast on 4 sts for underarm, pm, cast on 4 sts for underarm, patt to third m, place next 76 (84, 92, 100) sts on holder for sleeve, cast on 4 sts for underarm, pm, cast on 4 sts for underarm, patt to end = 274 (290, 306, 322) sts for body. Cont in patt as established for 25 cm. Bind off all sts.

**Sleeves:** With RS facing, beg at center of underarm, pick up and k4 sts along underarm cast-on, work 76 (84, 92, 100) held sleeve sts, pick up and k4 sts along underarm cast-on = 84 (92, 100, 108) sts. Work in garter st and shape sleeve as foll: Dec 1 st at each end of every 8th (every 6th, every 6th, every alt 4th and 6th) row 17 (19, 21, 23) times = 50 (54, 58 (62) sts. Work even until piece meas 42 (40 (38, 36) cm from pick-up row. Bind off all sts.

**Finishing:** Sew underarms. Sew sleeve seams. **Ties:** With size 4 mm dpns and 2 strands held tog, work 2 I-cord ties, each 30 cm long. Sew ties to right front edge, approx. 12 and 24 cm up from bottom edge. **Tie loops:** Try jacket on to determine best place for tie loops. With size 4 mm crochet hook, attach 2 strands held tog to left front. Make a 2 cm chain and attach to left front for tie loop. **Neck edging:** With size 4 mm crochet hook and 2 strands held tog work 1 row sl st along neck edge.

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
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## Gauge Swatch

### Before you begin ...

...make a gauge swatch. Use the recommended needles, yarns and pattern stitch for your gauge swatch. It should measure approx. 12 cm x 12 cm. Cast-on and bind-off rows, as well as selvage stitches should not be included in the measurement. Pin your swatch and block it as you would the finished pieces of the garment. Count stitches and rows over 10 cm. If your gauge swatch is too small, switch to larger needles. If your gauge swatch is too big, switch to smaller needles.



## Abbreviations

**beg** = begin(ning) · **ch** = chain · **cont** = continue · **dec** = decreas(e)(ing) · **inc** = increas(e)(ing) · **k** = knit · **kwise** = as if to knit  
**meas** = measures · **M1L** = lift strand between sts from front to back and knit this strand through the back loop · **M1R** = lift strand between sts from the back and knit this strand through the front loop · **patt** = pattern · **pm** = place marker · **p** = purl  
**pwise** = as if to purl · **rem** = remain(ing) · **rep** = repeat(s) · **rev St st** = reverse stockinette stitch · **rnd(s)** = round(s) · **RS** = right side · **sc** = single crochet · **skp** = slip 1 stitch as if to knit, knit 1 stitch, pass slipped stitch over knitted stitch · **sk2p** = slip 1 stitch as if to knit, knit 2 together, pass slipped stitch over knitted stitch · **s2kp** = slip 2 stitches as if to knit, k 1 stitch, pass slipped stitches over knitted stitch · **sl** = slip · **st(s)** = stitch(es) · **St st** = stockinette stitch · **tbl** = through the back loop · **tog** = together · **wyib** = with yarn in back of work · **wyif** = with yarn in front of work · **WS** = wrong side · **yo(s)** = yarn over(s)
