

1815 - Sweater with long stitches in Mayflower Cotton Merino Classic.

To achieve the best result, we recommend using Knit Pro needles, which is the professional tool for knitting and crochet.

## Pattern:

1.     - 4. r/rnd: Stockinette
1. r/rnd: Alternately knit 1 and yo
2. $\mathrm{r} / \mathrm{rnd}$ : Knit the sts in stockinette and at the same time drop the yarn over, so the stitches get long.
3. r/rnd: Like 5. r/rnd
4. r/rnd: Like 6. r/rnd

1 increase: Knit 1 through the back loop in the chain between the sts.

## Back and front piece.

Are knitted together up to the arm holes: Cast on 140(146)152(158)162(168) sts on needles US 6/UK 8 and knit ribbing (alternately knit 1 and purl 1). When the ribbing edge measures 5 cm , continue on needles US 8/UK 6 and in pattern.
Work straight until the work measures $41(42) 43(44) 45(46) \mathrm{cm}$ and split it into back and front pieces by the beginning of the round and after 70(73)76(79)81 (84) sts.
Back: Continue in pattern like before, while on the 1st row casting on 1 new edge sts in both sides = 72(75)78(81)83(86) sts. Work straight until the arm holes measure 19(20)21(22)23(24) cm. put the middle 20(21)22(23)23(24) sts on a stitch holder for the neckline and finish each side apart. Fasten off in the neck side on every other row another $1 \times 2$ sts and $1 \times 1$ sts. When the arm hole measures 21(22)23(24)25(26) cm, put the remaining $23(24) 25(26) 27(28)$ sts on a stitch holder for the shoulder. Knit the other side opposite.
Front piece: Is knitted like the back, but with a deeper neckline: When the armhole measures 14(15)16(17)18(19) cm, put the middle $6(7) 8(9) 9(10)$ sts on a stitch holder for the neckline. Finish each side apart. In the neck side on every other row fasten off another $1 \times 4$ sts, 1 x 3 sts, $1 \times 2$ sts and $1 \times 1$ sts. When the arm hole measures 21(22)23(24)25(26) cm, Knit the shoulder together with the corresponding shoulder on the back like so: Put the needles with the 23(24)25(26)27(28) shoulder sts together knit wise and knit the sts together in knit sts with 1 sts
from each needle. Fasten the sts off at the same time. Knit the other side opposite.

## Sleeves.

Cast on 38(38)40(40)42(42) sts on circular needles/double pointed needles US 6/UK 8 and knit around in ribbing (alternately knit 1 and purl 1). Put a marker at the beginning of the rnd. When the ribbing edge measures 10 cm , change to circular needles/double pointed needles US 8/UK 6. Continue in patter while on the first rnd increasing 24(24)26(26)28(28) sts evenly spread (= approx. * knit 1, inc 1, knit 2, inc 1, repeat from $\left.{ }^{*}\right)=62(62) 66(66) 70(70)$ sts. Then work straight in pattern until the sleeve measures $49(49) 50$
(50)51(51) cm and fasten off all sts loosely. Knit the other sleeve matching.

## Collar.

With circular needles US 6/UK 8 knit from the left shoulder 18 sts up + the waiting 6(7)8(9)9(10) sts +18 sts up along the neckline on the front piece and 7 sts up + the waiting $20(21) 22(23) 23(24)$ sts +7 sts up along the neckline on the back = in total 76(78)80(82)82(84) sts. Knit around in ribbing (alternately knit 1 and purl 1). When the collar measures 18 cm , fasten off loosely, the knit sts knit wise and the purl sts purl wise.

## Assembly.

Sew the sleeves on.
